3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Harmful by inhalation. Irritating to the respiratory system. Limited evidence of a carcinogenic effect. Irritating to eyes. May cause sensitisation by skin contact. Very toxic to aquatic organisms, may cause long-term adverse effects in the aquatic environment.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

General advice: Have the product container, label or Material Safety Data Sheet with you when calling the Syngenta emergency number, a Poison Control Centre or physician, or going for treatment.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. Keep patient warm and at rest. Call a physician or Poison Control Centre immediately.

Skin contact: Take off all contaminated clothing immediately. Wash off immediately with plenty of water. If skin irritation persists, call a physician. Wash contaminated clothing before re-use.

Eye contact: Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses. Immediate medical attention is required.

Ingestion: If swallowed, seek medical advice immediately and show this container or label. Do NOT induce vomiting.

MEDICAL ADVICE

There is no specific antidote available. Treat symptomatically.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

SUITABLE EXTINGUISHING MEDIA

Extinguishing media – small fires: Use water spray, alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

Extinguishing media - large fires: Use alcohol-resistant foam or water spray.

Extinguishing media which must not be used for safety reasons: Do not use a solid water stream as it may scatter and spread fire.

Specific hazards during fire fighting: As the product contains combustible organic components, fire will produce dense black smoke containing hazardous products of combustion (see section 10). Exposure to decomposition products may be a hazard to health.

Special protective equipment for fire fighters: Wear full protective clothing and self-contained breathing appparatus.

Further information: Do not allow run-off from fire fighting to enter drains or water courses. Cool closed containers exposed to fire with water spray.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions: Refer to protective measures listed in sections 7 and 8. **Environmental precautions:** Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Do not flush into surface water or sanitary sewer system.

Methods for cleaning up: Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible absorbent material, (e.g. sand, earth, diatomaceous earth, vermiculite) and place in container for disposal according to local/national regulations (see section 13).

Additional advice: If the product contaminates rivers and lakes or drains inform respective authorities.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Advice on safe handling: No special protective measures against fire required. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. When using, do not eat, drink or smoke. For personal protection see section 8.

Requirements for storage areas and containers: No special storage conditions required. Keep containers tightly closed in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place. Keep out of the reach of children. Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs.

Other data: Physically and chemically stable for at least 2 years when stored in the original unopened sales containers at ambient temperatures.

ENGINEERING MEASURES

Containment and/or segregation is the most reliable technical protection measure if exposure cannot be eliminated. The extent of these protection measures depends on the actual risks in use. If airborne mists or vapours are generated, use local exhaust ventilation controls. Assess exposure and use any additional measures to keep airborne levels below any relevant exposure limit. Where necessary, seek additional occupational hygiene advice.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Protective measures: The use of technical measures should always have priority over the use of personal protective equipment. When selecting personal protective equipment, seek appropriate professional advice. Personal protective equipment should be certified to appropriate standards.

Respiratory protection: A combination gas, vapour and particulate respirator may be necessary until effective technical measures are installed. Protection provided by air-purifying respirators is limited. 10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

Hazardous decomposition products: Combustion or thermal decomposition will evolve toxic and irritant vapours.

Hazardous reactions: None known. Hazardous polymerisation does not occur. Stable under normal conditions.

11. TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Acute Oral LD_{so}, female rat: >2,000 mg/kg. The toxicological data has been taken from products of similar composition.

Acute Inhalation $LC_{so'}$ rat: >1.04 mg/l, 4 h. The toxicological data has been taken from products of similar composition.

Acute Dermal LD_{so}, rat: >2,000 mg/kg. The toxicological data has been taken from products of similar composition.

Skin Irritation, rabbit: Mildly irritant. The toxicological data has been taken from products of similar composition.

Eye Irritation, rabbit: Irritating. The toxicological data has been taken from products of similar composition.

Sensitisation, guinea pig: A skin sensitiser. Derived from active ingredient(s).

LONG-TERM TOXICITY

Did not show mutagenic effects in animal experiments. Chlorothalonil causes kidney tumours in rats and mice via a non-genotoxic mode of action secondary to target organ toxicity. Maternal and foetal toxicity were observed at high dose levels of cyproconazole in studies on rats. No adverse effects in humans are expected at levels below the occupational exposure limit and when the product is handled and used according to the label.

12. ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION

ELIMINATION INFORMATION (PERSISTENCE AND DEGRADABILITY)

Bioaccumulation: Chlorothalonil has low potential for bioaccumulation. Cyproconazole does not bioaccumulate. Propiconazole has low to medium potential to bioaccumulate.

Stability in water: Chlorothalonil is not persistent in water. Cyproconazole is persistent in water. Propiconazole is stable in water.

Stability in soil: Chlorothalonil has low persistence in soil. Cyproconazole is moderate to very persistent in soil. Propiconazole is moderately to very persistent in soil.

Mobility: Chlorothalonil has low to slight mobility in soil. Cyproconazole has low to medium mobility in soil. Propiconazole has low to medium mobility in soil.

ECOTOXICITY EFFECTS

Toxicity to Fish: LC₅₀ Oncorhynchus mykiss (rainbow trout), 0.5 mg/l, 96h.

Toxicity to Aquatic Invertebrates: EC_{so} *Daphnia magna* (water flea), 280 µg/l, 48 h. Based on test results obtained with similar product.

Toxicity to Algae: EbC_{so} *Pseudokirchneriella subcapitata* (green algae) 0.77 mg/l, 72h. Based on test results obtained with similar product.

Toxicity to Algae: ErC₅₀ *Pseudokirchneriella subcapitata* (green algae) 3.1 mg/l, 72h. Based on test results obtained with similar product.

13. DISPOSAL CONSIDERATIONS

Product: Do not contaminate ponds, waterways or ditches with chemical or used container. Do not dispose of waste into sewer. Where possible recycling is preferred to disposal or incineration. If recycling is not practicable, dispose of in compliance with local regulations.
