3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Harmful by inhalation. Irritating to respiratory system. Limited evidence of a carcinogenic effect. Risk of serious damage to eyes. May cause sensitisation by skin contact. Very toxic to aquatic organisms, may cause long-term adverse effects in the aquatic environment.

4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

ENGINEERING MEASURES
