Description of first aid measures

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Symptoms after ingestion : After gavage to rats, no clinical signs of toxicity were observed throughout the 14-day

observation period.

Symptoms after skin contact : After intradermal injection in the guinea-pig, erythema, eschar and desquamation of the

epidermis were observed.

Symptoms after inhalation : After 4-hour inhalation exposure of rats, there were no clinical signs attributed to the test article.

: After instillation in eyes of rabbits, a single instillation elicited conjunctival irritation, which did Symptoms after eye contact

> not exceed a diffuse crimson colour in the sentinel rabbit, injection of the blood vasculature in the main study rabbits, swelling with partial eversion of the eyelids and some slight discharge were

seen in all animals. All irritation reactions had resolved by four or five days after dosing.
